



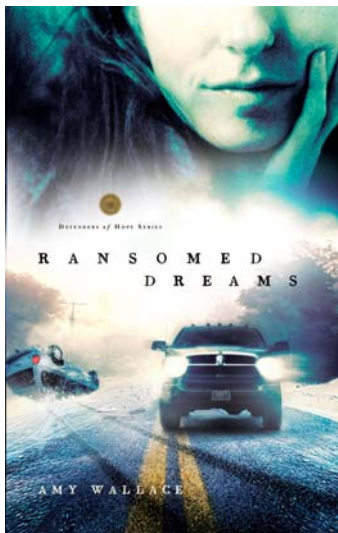

Set Free to Live Debut author offers hope through forgiveness
